TOPIC: Rebuild Personal Morality

These Blessing Declarations are submitted to you by the [Kingdom Stewards Network \(KSN\)](#) which is a statewide prayer movement empowering believers to speak God's word over their territory (home, neighborhood, church, city, county, etc.). The vision is to stake God's claim for His Kingdom on earth in Colorado as it is in Heaven. It also entails shifting the spiritual atmosphere of every Colorado community so that each region aligns with their redemptive gifts and purposes and more people come to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Blessing Saturdays

The mission of each Blessing Saturday is to engage believers in every community to individually (or with friends/family), to speak the blessings of God's Word over our state. This is in accordance with what is written in Isaiah 55:11, "so is My word that goes out from My mouth: It will not return to me empty but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it."

Instructions:

When? 2nd and 4th Saturdays at 9am

Where? At a location outside.

Preparation: Be sure to spend 10+ minutes praising God and worshipping Him and positioning yourself seated in Christ in heavenly places (Eph 2:6) before speaking the Declarations. Enthroned Jesus as King over yourself and your territory and invite Him to intercede with You today.

How? To be declared out loud with boldness and confidence, on your own or with others.

Pause: Don't rush through the Blessing Declarations. Pause after each one taking time to listen for Holy Spirit's input regarding anything He might want you to add.

Rebuild Personal Morality

Building godly morality means establishing our lives, families, churches, communities, and nation upon the righteous standards of God revealed in His Word. The Bible teaches that morality is not determined by changing cultural opinions, but by the character and commands of a holy and righteous God. We are called to love God and love others, reject what is evil, embrace what is good, pursue justice, practice truth, honor life, uphold marriage and family, care for the vulnerable, and conduct ourselves with integrity, purity, humility, and love. Godly morality begins in the heart through repentance and transformation by the Holy Spirit, then becomes evident in our words, choices, relationships, and actions. As believers faithfully teach and model biblical truth, they become "salt and light" in the world, helping restore what has been weakened, rebuild what has been broken, and establish a culture that honors God while reflecting His righteousness and inspiring others to do the same.

Blessing Declarations Sept 12: Rebuild Personal Morality

1. We bless every Coloradan to seek God through repentance as written in Acts 3:19-20, “Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, and that He may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you—even Jesus.”
2. We bless every person in Colorado to become a new creation in Christ as it is written in Colossians 3:5-10 “Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator.”
3. We invite every Colorado believer to align with God’s moral standards as written in 1 Peter 1:14-16 “As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: “Be holy, because I am holy.”
4. We bless and encourage the Colorado Ecclesia to proactively embrace God’s Commandments found in Mark 12:30-31 making them the foundation of moral living;” ‘And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.’ This is the first commandment. And the second, like it, is this: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no other commandment greater than these.”
5. As it is written in Proverbs 3:3, we invite Colorado believers to “Let love and faithfulness never leave you; bind them around your neck, write them on the tablet of your heart.”
6. As it is written in Romans 12:10, we encourage everyone in Colorado to “Love one another with brotherly affection [as members of one family], giving precedence and showing honor to one another.”
7. We bless every follower of Jesus in, and from, Colorado to reflect the personal morality described in Galatians 5:22-23 (AMPC), “the fruit of the [Holy] Spirit [the work which His presence within accomplishes] is love, joy (gladness), peace, patience (an even temper, forbearance), kindness, goodness (benevolence), faithfulness, Gentleness (meekness, humility), self-control (self-restraint, continence). Against such things there is no law [that can bring a charge].”
8. We declare to the people of Colorado as it is written in Matthew 5:8, “Blessed [anticipating God’s presence, spiritually mature] are the pure in heart [those with integrity, moral courage, and godly character], for they will see God.”
9. We bless every Colorado believer to walk in the protection of integrity and uprightness as written in Psalm 25:21, “May integrity and uprightness protect me, because my hope, Lord, is in you.”
10. We encourage every Christian statewide to keep a clear conscience by actively pursuing forgiveness and repentance to maintain Godly Character and good behavior as written in 1 Peter 3:16, “Keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander.”
11. We bless Coloradans to seek the cleansing of their mind and their words as written in Isaiah 6:5-7 (NKJV), “Woe is me, for I am undone! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, The Lord of hosts.” Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal which he had taken with the tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth with it, and said: “Behold, this has touched your lips; Your iniquity is taken away, And your sin purged.””

12. As it is written in 1 Thessalonians 5:22, we encourage every person in Colorado to “Abstain from every form of evil.”
13. We bless the Colorado Ecclesia with the truth of Proverbs 28:6, “Better the poor whose walk is blameless than the rich whose ways are perverse.”
14. We bless Colorado believers with friendship with God as written in Proverbs 22:11 (AMPC), “He who loves purity and the pure in heart and who is gracious in speech—because of the grace of his lips will he have the king for his friend.”
15. We bless the Colorado people of God with the command written in Isaiah 1:17, “Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow.”
16. We invite every Colorado believer to align with the words of Colossians 3:12 (AMP) “So, as God’s own chosen people, who are holy [set apart, sanctified for His purpose] and well-beloved [by God Himself], put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience [which has the power to endure whatever injustice or unpleasantness comes, with good temper].”
17. Believers are also invited to align with the personal character described in Proverbs 12:22 “The Lord detests lying lips, but He delights in people who are trustworthy.”
18. We bless every believer in Colorado to abide by morality of the Ten Commandments, especially those written in Exodus 20:13–17, “You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor’s house; you shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, or his male slave, or his female slave, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.”
19. We declare over Colorado as it is written in Matthew 5:9 (AMP), “Blessed [spiritually calm with life-joy in God’s favor] are the makers and maintainers of peace, for they will [express His character and] be called the sons of God.”
20. We bless every Colorado Believer with the peace written about in Philippians 4:8-9, “Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.”

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
