FAQ for Prayer on Capitol Hill

Who are the legislators and staff?

At this time, we are not sharing names out of caution from how the enemy works. Suffice it to say they are believers who have felt the call of God to exalt His name at the capitol. This is a genuine, heart-felt request, and an incredible opportunity as they are opening the doors for us. First and foremost, they believe God would be pleased with worship and prayer coming from the capitol. Second, they sense a real darkness and are requesting help to lift the oppression and spiritual attack. Third, they see a need to minister to those who serve our state, regardless of party affiliation.

What is the Session Launch?

We want to connect the connectors and pray together for the 84 days. In gathering we will build relationships, share the vision, orient ourselves to the task, and pray a blessing on the initiative given to us. In the morning we will worship, pray, fellowship, and visit the capitol building so point people will know what to do when their day arrives. In the afternoon we will meet with legislators and staff to worship, hear encouraging words, and pray blessings over our senators and representatives.

Where is the Session Launch?

We have two locations in mind, and are waiting for final word. The meeting will be held close to the capitol building. Just before lunch we will tour the capitol so that point people will know where their people can go to pray.

Who is facilitating this?

Who can be involved?

Point people from each county/city are selected by the facilitators. Point people can share the invitation with whomever they want in their area. Pastors who are invited by the point person will be given a passcode to the website where their congregants can sign up for prayer. Our intention is that prayer warriors will only be allowed to participate through their church. In other words, the pastors are the gate-keepers for who will be given access.

What do you mean by access?

Each county/city will be assigned a day. Each church in that location is invited to travel to the capitol on that day. In order to get in to the morning meeting, a person must be signed up through our website. The website has a secure page for sign-up so they must get the key from their pastor to get in. At the door we will have a list of people who have signed up. This will hopefully keep disrupters from getting in, if people even are aware of what is going on. We hope to be discrete.

Can we pray on other days beside our official county/city day?

Absolutely. Once a person is given the key to the secure page, they can sign up for as many days as they want. We know some prayer warriors might do every day if they live close by!

Where are we having the morning orientation?

Again, we are waiting to hear back from our most desired location. We will let you know final details at our orientation. On that morning we will meet at 7:30am to worship and pray for the day, and give up-to-date info on prayer points and other relevant information. The House and Senate sessions start at 9am, so we need to be in the building by that time.

Where will we pray in the capitol?

The capitol is open to the public, so we are welcome to be in the building. The balcony area of the house and senate chambers are available to us as long as we are quiet. This is where we will pray. When the legislators are dismissed to committee meetings, we are welcome to join them. Again, we will be discrete, peaceful, and honoring. We are there to pray, not participate or interrupt.

How are we praying?

First of all, it is important to know that we are not praying for issues or candidates to be elected, per say. This is not the prayer initiative of the Republican Party. Think of Joshua when he asked the commander of the Lord's army, "Are you for us or for our adversary?" The Lord said, "No...but I have now come." We are their representing the kingdom of heaven. We pray the will of God, and a blessing on all who work there. We pray peace. We pray for eyes to be enlightened and truth to be revealed. We pray against darkness. Pray the Word, pray the Word, pray the Word.

What do we do with things we get in prayer?

We are looking for words and insights people get in prayer. At our website, in the secure area, we will have a section where people can share what they received in prayer, what they observed that day, or what positive experience they had.

What other logistics do we need to know?

Details will be relayed as details are finalized. There is more information we need to pass along. That is why we are having a Session Launch, and we hope you can make it!

How will we gauge success?

First, if we cover all 84 days with worship in the morning and prayer during the day, we have succeeded. Second, we will be listening for testimonies from the legislators and staffers who work there. We will share those as well along the way.
