



## *Leader: Position Profile*

### Prayer Leader Qualifications:

Candidates for the volunteer Prayer Leader position for a Civic Prayer Team will possess the following:

- Is a bible-believing follower of Jesus Christ.
- Agrees to the Vision and Mission of *Colorado Prays and the Civic Prayer Team Initiative*
- Has led some form of regular prayer meeting in a group setting
- Can provide a reference from their pastor or ministry leader
- Is willing to commit to leading the Civic Prayer Team for at least 6 months
- Has administrative skills to manage the prayer time making each call or meeting inclusive for as many participants as possible – or can recruit someone to help with administration.
- Understands and is willing to obtain prayer points from local resources (government, education, church and marketplace)
- Has a gifting of discernment and good listening skills
- Is technically savvy to use an online app from the computer or smartphone or able to recruit someone to help with online technologies.

### Prayer Leader Responsibilities

A *Civic Prayer Team* Prayer Leader is responsible for scheduling and running one or more regularly scheduled prayer calls or meetings for their county (or city) including the following:

- Deciding and managing the day, time and frequency of the *Civic Prayer Team* Prayer Call or meeting.
- Communicating with *Civic Prayer Team* leadership at least monthly
- Communicate with your call participants at least as frequently as you hold a call or meeting
- Recruiting people to join your Civic Prayer Team
- Encouraging call participants to join the online prayer group to communicate in between prayer calls.
- Raising up a Co-Prayer Leader from among the participants
- Getting the prayer call or meeting access info to participants via email, text or the online group.
- Send email reminders for each Civic Prayer Team meeting: 1 day prior to your call
- Assure that a scribe records the prayer points, prophetic words & praise reports during the call and emails a Prayer Report to participants and posts to the online group at [www.coprays.org](http://www.coprays.org).
- Build a prayer team that will engage with civic leaders including the mayor, police chief, fire chief, superintendent of schools, county commissioners, city council members, school board members, key business leaders, etc. to let them know they are being covered in prayer and to solicit prayer needs.
- Publish a periodic County or City Prayer Guide to be distributed to churches in the area.
