TOPIC: **Forgive Us as We Forgive**

These Blessing Declarations are submitted to you by the [Kingdom Stewards Network \(KSN\)](#) which is a statewide prayer movement empowering believers to speak God's word over their territory (home, neighborhood, church, city, county, etc.). The vision is to stake God's claim for His Kingdom on earth in Colorado as it is in Heaven. It also entails shifting the spiritual atmosphere of every Colorado community so that each region aligns with their redemptive gifts and purposes and more people come to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Blessing Saturdays

The mission of each Blessing Saturday is to engage believers in every community to individually (or with friends/family), to speak God's Word over our state. This is in accordance with what is written in Isaiah 55:11, "so is My word that goes out from My mouth: It will not return to me empty but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it."

Instructions:

When? 2nd and 4th Saturdays at 9am

Where? At a location outside.

Preparation: Be sure to spend 10+ minutes praising God and worshipping Him and positioning yourself seated in Christ in heavenly places (Eph 2:6) before speaking the Declarations. Enthroned Jesus as King over yourself and your territory and invite Him to intercede with You today.

How? To be declared out loud with boldness and confidence, on your own or with others.

Pause: Don't rush through the Blessing Declarations. Pause after each one taking time to listen for the Lord's in put regarding anything He might want you to add.

Forgive Us as We Forgive

Through July of this year, we will be releasing Blessing Declarations based on the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6. This month, we will speak blessing declarations addressing verse 12 which tells us to "... forgive us our debts, as we have forgiven our debtors (NKJV). Forgiveness emphasizes extending mercy to others as God extends it to us, as well as, cleansing and releasing grudges. God tells us to forgive so that we can be forgiven by Him (Matthew 6:14-15). Forgiveness is not an option, it is a reflection of God's kindness and mercy shown to us. Forgiveness toward another who has trespassed against us is a heart-level action that releases bitterness and anger, whether there is physical reconciliation or not. Through Jesus Christ a divine example is given, it is complete and undeserved forgiveness that is offered all because of our Father's great and mighty love for us. Matthew 26:28, "For this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Blessing Declarations May 23: *Forgive Us as We Forgive*

1. On behalf of the people of Colorado, we now choose to forgive as Jesus taught us in Matthew 6:12 TPT “Forgive us the wrongs we have done as we ourselves release forgiveness to those who have wronged us.”
2. We bless the believers of Colorado with the wisdom, freedom and required action of Matthew 6:14-15 AMP: “For if you forgive people their trespasses [their reckless and willful sins, leaving them, letting them go, and giving up resentment], your heavenly Father will also forgive you.”
3. We bless Coloradans with the reminder of Mark 11:25-26 AMPC which tells us “And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him and let it drop (leave it, let it go), in order that your Father Who is in heaven may also forgive you your [own] failings and shortcomings and let them drop. But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your failings and shortcomings.
4. We bless the people of Colorado with the freedom to receive and apply Eph 4:32 NLT, “Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”
5. We bless The Colorado Ecclesia to receive the love and mercy of God which allows them to put into action what is written in Colossians 3:13 ESV, “Bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.”
6. We bless Believers statewide with Luke 6:37 ESV, “Judge not, and you will not be judged; condemn not, and you will not be condemned; forgive, and you will be forgiven;” that they will learn to move in Your grace and mercy toward one another.
7. We declare Matthew 18:21-22 ESV to the people of Colorado as it speaks of unlimited forgiveness, “Then Peter came up and said to him, “Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?” Jesus said to him, “I do not say to you seven times, but seventy-seven times.”
8. We bless Coloradans to seek mercy and love over offense as written in Proverbs 17:9 AMPC, “He who covers and forgives an offense seeks love, but he who repeats or harps on a matter separates even close friends.”
9. We bless the Colorado Ecclesia with good sense as presented in Proverbs 19:11 ESV “Good sense makes one slow to anger, and it is His glory to overlook an offense.”
10. We declare Luke 17:3-4 NKJV over the Colorado Ecclesia, “Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, ‘I repent,’ you must forgive him.”
11. We bless Your Ecclesia with the revelation of the need to forgive as written in Romans 12:19 ESV, “Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, “Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.”

12. We encourage Colorado Believers to forgive and bless those who wrong them as it is written in 1 Peter 3:9, "Do not repay evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary, bless, for to this you were called, that you may obtain a blessing.
 13. We bless Colorado believers with the desire to respond to God's forgiveness as recorded in Ephesians 4:32 TPT, "But instead be kind and affectionate toward one another. Has God graciously forgiven you? Then graciously forgive one another in the depths of Christ's love."
 14. We bless Colorado with an increase in people who love one another as written in 1 Peter 4:8 "Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins."
 15. We ask Lord that You prompt Colorado Believers to mirror God's character of forgiveness as He revealed Himself to Moses in Exodus 34: 6-7 which tells us "The LORD, the LORD God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in loving devotion and truth, maintaining loving devotion to a thousand generations, forgiving iniquity, transgression, and sin."
 16. We bless the Colorado Ecclesia with the message of reconciliation as described in 2 Corinthians 5: 18-19 ESV "All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation."
